Reshaping Curricula: Dialogues in Decolonization

The outcome of the consultation on changing building names associated with Bristol's role in the transatlantic slave trade, and as part of the decolonisation initiative has just been released. The university have decided to disassociate themselves with the Colston family, removing their dolphin insignia from the logo. This comes just six months after renaming a university residence that was labelled after the family name. The university are sighting indirect ties, on this basis, but have remained in alignment with both the Will and Fry family, who have ties in funding to the institution. Both of which also had hands in the slave trade. There has been a further promise established of a 10 year reparative futures investment programme, costing £10million.
