Motion Name: Implement recycling soft / flexible plastic at Bristol University

## **Background:**

- 1. Soft and flexible plastics cause significant environmental harm when not recycled properly.
- 2. Soft plastic and Flexible plastic are often left unrecycled despite making up a large proportion of plastic waste items such as crisp packets and lots of plastic packaging for food
- 3. Currently, recycling these plastics is impractical as it requires finding a supermarket that accepts it for recycling. This is difficult and often requires an excessively long journey, and the majority of students do not have the means (i.e. having a car) or the time to do so.
- 4. City councils such as Newcastle and Cheltenham have weekly collections for this type of plastic packaging

## Purpose:

- 1. We want to reduce the workload of students trying to recycle and help the environment
- 2. We want to help Bristol students recycle their plastic waste by making it much easier and much more accessible.
- 3. We want the university to make it easier to recycle soft and flexible plastics by having clearly marked bins for soft and flexible plastics on campus and in student accommodation

## **Actions:**

- 1. Lobby the university to implement recycling bins for soft / flexible plastics in kitchens at student accommodations and larger bins (where weekly rubbish collections will occur) for people to empty into.
- 2. Create a poster indicating the different types of plastic and which bin to recycle each one into and lobby the University to hang these up in accommodation kitchens
