**Motion Name:** Bristol SU to Lobby an in-house University Guarantor Scheme

## **Background:**

1. The following points have inspired the work that the current officers (2024-2025) have been undertaking to try to best serve students in an increasingly difficult rental landscape. We have added some new actions to reflect the current undertakings.

- 2. Most landlords in the city require a UK Homeowner to guarantee a student's rent for the year.
- 3. If a student cannot provide this, landlords either request a full year's rent up front, or these students must pay out hundreds of pounds to a private guarantor service, such as Housing Hand.
- 4. The University has a partnership with Housing Hand, however the costs of using this service is £225. This price is increasing for the next academic year.
- 5. The Student Living and International Students' Officers this year have been lobbying the University to support setting up an in-house guarantor scheme to prevent students from needing to go via Housing Hand.
- 6. They have been pushing initially for the University to pilot an in-house guarantor scheme for up to 100 students and, if successful, for this scheme to become a permanent fixture of the University's offer of accommodation support to students and support an open-ended number of students.
- 7. Other universities such as Edinburgh, Sheffield, UCL, Cardiff and Sussex have such a scheme.
- 8. The University Accommodation Group voted to endorse this proposal but have not been successful in securing the funding for next year to implement this scheme.
- 9. We are so close to making this a reality and need future Officer teams to hold the University to account to ensure this scheme becomes a reality.

## Purpose:

- 1. To ensure equity in rental experience for International and Widening Participation students by campaigning for a service to mitigate the impact of the unfair guarantor system in private renting.
- 2. To prevent private companies from profiting off student need for a home by setting up a replacement in-house guarantor service.
- 3. To protect the wellbeing of students living in the private rental sector by removing one of the known stresses around private renting.

## Actions:

- 1. Bristol SU Student Living and International Student's Officers to take this project on as a priority next year.
- 2. Bristol SU Student Living and International Students' Officers to meet with the university stakeholders to discuss implementing a pilot of the in-house guarantor service.
- 3. Bristol SU Student Living and International Students' Officers to run a focus group next year with International or Widening Participation students to gain an evidence basis for this work and sense-check the current proposal for the scheme.
- 4. Once a pilot has been secured, Bristol SU Student Living and International Students' Officers to continue to lobby the University to make the in-house guarantor scheme permanent and able to support an open-ended number of students.
- 5. SU officers should explore other options of providing students with a way to access housing easily and affordably. They should engage with the student community and the wider renting scene.
- 6. SU officers should look at alternative services to Housing Hand and push for the renter's rights bill to reflect the struggles that students face by engaging with local charities and politicians.
