Motion Name: Remove the Colston Dolphin from the University Crest and Stop Selling Merchandise Featuring It

Proposer: Jae-Hyun Jo

Background:

- 1. The University of Bristol committed itself to anti-racist action in 2023 through the Reparative Futures Programme and removed the Colston dolphin from its logo accordingly.
- 2. Although the University mentions the crest in its report, and though the crest still features the Colston dolphin, there have not been any public discussion nor action regarding the crest.
- 3. The crest, although not officially the University logo, is still frequently used to represent the University. For example, merchandise featuring the crest is sold by Bristol SU.

Purpose:

- 1. To promote the welfare of Bristol Students by pressuring the University to follow through fully on its commitment to anti-racism.
- 2. To ensure that Bristol SU does not profit from the University's history of racism by selling merchandise featuring Colston's emblem.

Actions:

- 1. For officers of the SU to lobby the University to pursue steps to remove the dolphin from its crest.
- 2. For the officers to publicise any response they receive from the University to the student body.
- 3. For the SU to cease the sale of all products featuring the Colston dolphin on its store and develop new designs in its stead that can represent all Bristol students.
- 4. For the SU to commit itself to not using any imagery depicting the dolphin in any capacity and to not use any racist imagery.
